

# **Mass Transit Briefing: Ward Councillors**



## Launch of public consultation for Mass Transit – phase one

- The public consultation for Mass Transit
   Phase One is now confirmed. It will run from Monday 15<sup>th</sup> July to Monday 30<sup>th</sup>

  September.
- The dates for the consultation period were revised after the calling of the general election.
- The consultation will run for a total of 11 weeks and feature a range of communication and engagement methods to enable everyone across West Yorkshire to get in touch and give their views.



### **Route options**

- The consultation will ask the public for views on the first two lines that are proposed for Mass Transit in Phase One. These are:
  - The Leeds Line St James' Hospital, through Leeds City Centre to the White Rose Shopping Centre.
  - The Bradford Line Bradford city centre to Leeds city centre, from Bradford Forster Square to City Square in Leeds, but also offering connections to St James' Hospital and the White Rose Centre.
- A total of seven options for the Leeds Line will be consulted on:
  - Four options for Leeds City Centre Section from St James' to the River Aire at Victoria Bridge;
  - Three options from the River Aire at Victoria Bridge, south to the white Rose Shopping Centre.
- A total of three options will be consulted on for the Bradford Line between Bradford city centre and Leeds city centre.




### **Areas of focus**

At the consultation we are asking people to:

- Let us know which options they support for the Leeds Line
- Let us know which options they support for the Bradford Line
- Let us know what they think about our approach to sustainability and placemaking - how we will develop an environmentally, socially and economically sustainable Mass Transit system with improved public spaces.

The consultation will also inform the public that early work on a future extension of Mass Transit to Kirklees is also underway.



### Impacts on property and land

In the process of developing schemes of this size and scale, it is inevitable that the final routes will impact properties and land.

We acknowledge this reality and wish to highlight at this early stage that no decisions have been made.

We are taking proactive steps to engage with individuals and property owners along or in close proximity to the proposed routes, and are inviting them to view our proposals, attend community consultation events, and provide their feedback.

### Consultation web pages

Full information on the proposals and route options. The **feedback survey** will also be hosted online.

### Consultation brochure

Available for download from the website and provides a full assessment of each route option.

### Consultation leaflet

Being sent to every address with a postcode within the Leeds and Bradford boundaries.

### Consultation email and telephone enquiries

An email address and the Metro telephone line will be available for public questions or for information on alternative ways to provide feedback.

### Pre-recorded consultation presentation

Will be available on the route options, featuring a voice-over commentary, subtitles and British Sign Language to ensure accessibility.

### Live webinars

Three public webinars will be hosted across the consultation period providing information on the consultation and a 'Question and Answer' session.


### Public drop-in events

23 face-to-face drop-in events will be hosted in communities along the route options.



### **Engagement with potentially affected properties**


- A targeted letter will also be sent to properties along or in close vicinity of the routes.
- This is to ensure that any property that could potentially be impacted by Mass Transit as the Phase One proposals are developed are aware of the consultation and have the opportunity to get involved.
- The targeted letter is in addition to a leaflet promoting the consultation that is being sent to all properties with postcodes across Leeds and Bradford.

## What is the Local Transport Plan and why is it important?

- Statutory document
- Sets strategic direction for the future of transport across West Yorkshire
- A new Local Transport Plan is needed to respond to the scale of change since the current plan was adopted in 2017.
- Our renewed Local Transport Plan is being co-developed by the Combined Authority and Local Authorities.
- The new Vision led LTP will build on other existing plans and strategies.
- This summer:
  - Local Transport Plan engagement on vision and objectives
  - Mass Transit consultation on phase 1 route options
  - Both 15 July to 30 September
- We aim for the renewed LTP to be adopted by early 2026
