

Mass Transit Briefing: August update

August 2024



Update on phase one consultation

- The public consultation for Mass Transit phase one started on Monday 15th July and will run until 11.59pm on Monday 30th September.
- To date, there has been a good response with more than 2,700 people have completed the feedback survey and more than 320 people have either attended one of the public drop-in events being held across Leeds and Bradford or the first live webinar held on the consultation.
- Approaching **60,000** visitors have viewed the Mass Transit Consultation Hub page.



Public drop-in events

- We are hosting a number of public-drops in events as part of the public consultation for the people of West Yorkshire to ask questions, meet the Mass Transit team and get involved
- Each event will see a senior member of the project team, members of the consultation team and the land team, on hand to answer any questions attendees have.
- Regrettably, due to the recent public protests and related unrest across a number of UK cities, a decision was taken to postpone some consultation drop-in events during this period of unrest to ensure public and staff safety. We have confirmed new replacement dates for these events.
